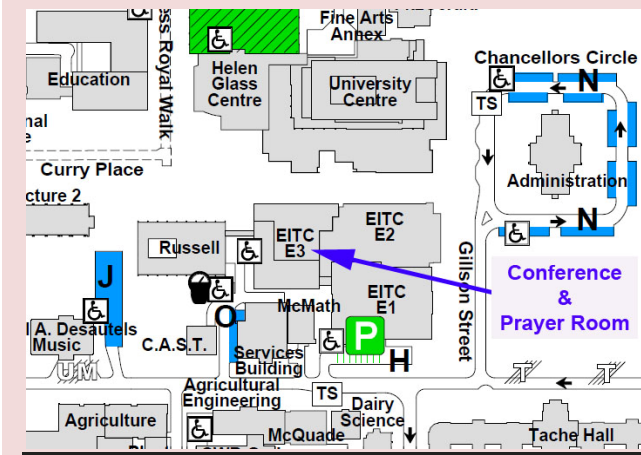

BIOGRAPHY OF THE SPEAKERS:

Sheikh Abdur Raheem Green

Sheikh Abdur Raheem Green was born in Dar 'es salaam in Tanzania. His father was a colonial administrator in the then extant British Empire. By the time he was walking the old colonies were getting their independence, and they moved back to the UK. At the age of ten he was sent to a Roman Catholic Monastic boarding school, Gilling Castle and then onto Ampleforth College. It was there that he really started to question what life was all about and how much sense the traditions he was being brought up with really made.

His father was working for Barcalys Bank International and was sent to Cairo to set up a branch of the Bank there. That's where he spent ten years of holidays and the contrast of cultures only spurred him question further.

It was while he was working in the City that his delving into every aspect of spirituality, philosophy and psychology came to a head. He was fed up. There were perhaps no answers. Maybe life was just about getting rich and enjoying yourself. It was then he picked up a copy of the Quran. Upon reading it he was convinced that it was revelation from God, and thus started his journey into Islam. He started to seriously practice the religion in 1987 and since that time he has been involved in letting others know about this divinely ordained way of life.

Sheikh Jamal Hammoud

Sheikh Jamal Hammoud is the senior Imam of the Muslim community In Calgary, responsible for spiritual leadership and guidance of Calgary's eighty thousand Muslims. After winning a world-wide competition in Quran Memorization in 1981, he graduated with high honours from the esteemed Islamic University of Al Medina (with a major on Fiqh), and has served Muslim communities throughout the world ever since.

His particular insight and expertise has brought great change to the field of Da'wah (Islamic outreach) in Canada for the last twenty-five years.

A powerful force successfully promoting inclusive unity within the Muslim community of Calgary itself, Sk. Hammoud's vision of diverse Muslim communities working together for the sake of others has become increasingly popular throughout the rest of Canada as well.

He is the author of many papers on Islam and Fiqh and has written a book on "Islam and Terrorism". Chairperson of Dar Al-Fatwa North America, he is the main representative of the grand Mufti of Lebanon and the Council of Islamic Courts in Lebanon.

Sheikh Ismael Mukhtar

Sheikh Ismael Mukhtar was taught Arabic, Quran and Islam by his late father who held the position of the Mufti of Eritrea as well as many other scholarly positions. He is known to be well read in all Islamic subjects with special interest in Islamic history and Islamic thought.

He carries a degree in management from the University of Manitoba as well as a professional accounting designation (CGA). He has traveled through Europe and the Arab world and has resided in Winnipeg for many years.

He sits on a number of committees and held a number of positions including: Ex_Chairman of Muslim Association of Canada (MAC), Ex_Senior Trustee of the Manitoba Islamic Association (MIA); currently he serves as the Editor of Manitoba Muslim Magazine.

Many communities have come to know Sheikh Ismael's balanced approach through his Khutbas, lectures, articles and community work. Besides his native languages, he fluently speaks Arabic and English. Currently he works with a major Canadian investment firm.
